

How the Games Work

Fortune Pai Gow

Keep it fun.
Learn how the games work before you play.

Fortune Pai Gow Poker is played using a deck of 52 cards, plus one Joker. The Joker can be used only as an Ace, or to complete a straight, a flush, or a straight flush. To win, you must beat the banker hands.

All bets must be placed before any cards are dealt. Each player receives seven cards face-down, and splits them into two separate hands – one of five cards, called ‘the back’, and one of two cards, called ‘the front’. In order to win, both the two-card hand and the five-card hand must be higher in value than the banker’s two-card and five-card hands. A *push* (tie) occurs when only one of your two hands is higher in value than the dealer’s corresponding hand.

Winning hands are paid even money (1:1). When a push occurs, the player keeps the original bet. The winnings of each player and the net winnings of the player/banker are subject to a five per cent commission collected by the dealer.

Fortune Pai Gow Poker offers a side bet that pays a bonus only on your hand. You may place a wager up to \$50 on the Fortune Bonus bet before the cards are dealt.

Any Fortune Bonus bet of \$5 or greater automatically qualifies for the Envy Bonus payout. If a hand value of Four-of-a-Kind or greater appears in the round, the Envy Bonus will be paid out to all qualified players in the round who do not have that hand. The dealer’s hand never qualifies as an Envy Bonus hand even when the dealer is not the banker.

Fortune Pai Gow Poker Bonus Payout Chart

Qualifying Hands	Fortune Bonus	Envy Bonus Payout
7-Card Straight Flush - no Joker	8,000 to 1	\$5,000
Royal Flush Plus Royal Match	2,000 to 1	\$1,000
7-Card Straight Flush - with Joker	1,000 to 1	\$500
Five Aces	400 to 1	\$250
Royal Flush	150 to 1	\$50
Straight Flush	50 to 1	\$20
Four of a Kind	25 to 1	\$5
Full House	5 to 1	N/A
Flush	4 to 1	N/A
Three of a Kind	3 to 1	N/A
Straight	2 to 1	N/A

Royal Flush may be with or without a Joker. Royal Match is a King and Queen of the same suit.
